GUEST SPEAKER

Brant, an Environmental Education Specialist at the Middle Creek Wildlife Management Area, was on hand to speak about what he and his team accomplish throughout any given year. On over 6,000 acres, a native and diverse habitat is maintained to attract a variety of wildlife, both land and water, but the most popular attraction is the snow goose migration occurring in February. Up to 120,000 waterfowl can be counted on the water but 80,000 was the count this year. Before sunrise is when a count is made a few times a week. Hiking trails can be found scattered about. He packed a lot of information in his 30 minute presentation. A Q & A followed.
