TAKE A HIKE ....

SATURDAY APRIL 13, 2024



1:00pm At High Bridge Reservoir, in Pine Grove Township, Schuylkill Co (Rt 443 to 301 Old Forge Road...just outside Lickdale....near Swatara State Park)

Take an afternoon trek into the wilderness with your hosts Brian and Dianne Bachman. Considered a moderately challenging route, hike this somewhat desolate, beautiful 4.1 loop around the reservoir. You'll encounter a shady "tunnel" created by groves of rhododendron and mountain laurel, cross Fishing Creek on a 20' long braided cable wire "bridge" not once, but twice! And hike up and down Sharp Mountain. At one point, we will end up on the tail end of the Stony Valley rail trail. The terrain can be rocky and rugged at times, so good hiking shoes are a must. Dogs are permitted but I wouldn't recommend it.

At the onset will be the parking area in view of the historical landmark of Swatara Iron Furnace and Ironmaster's Mansion....circa 1830. Don't forget to check them out.

Expect the hike to take at least two hours. Prepare accordingly and dress in layers. You'll get approximately 13,000 steps in (if you're counting) and burn enough calories to eat at Moose's LZ afterward. Unfortunately, rain will cancel the hike due to safety.

## SCHUYLKILL RIVER TRAIL BIKE RIDE SATURDAY MAY 25, 2024

Arrive: 10:30 Depart: 11:00

Enjoy a very beautiful and informative bike ride in the Schuylkill River Greenways National Heritage Area. The river trail is a multi-use path that will extend 120 miles from Frackville in Schuylkill County, through Berks, Chester and Montgomery Counties to Philadelphia. It travels through the historically rich region of southeastern Pennsylvania. The trail passes through rural, agricultural, suburban, urban and industrial landscapes.

Our one-day trip will begin at the Main Street Trailhead, 2 N. Main Street, Phoenixville. You'll find The Schuylkill River Heritage Center there. We'll travel to Valley Forge National Historic Park and along the way we'll take a side trip to Lock 60 in Canal Park. When we arrive at the Valley Forge, a quick stop at the Visitor Center and then off to Washington's Headquarters and the Historic Valley Forge Station via the Joseph Plumb Martin Loop. Named after a soldier in the Continental Army, it connects several historic sites. The river route is relatively flat, but the Park is somewhat hilly and provides limited shade. The round trip would be approximately 20-25 miles depending how far one would want to venture into the Park. An evening meal and adult beverages will be scheduled for the Sedona Taphouse.

#### **Gettysburg Bike Tour**

Friday, September 27 to Sunday, September 29, 2024

If you like the fall, outdoors, bicycling and history you will enjoy this bicycle ride around the historical Gettysburg National

Battlefield.

Plans are underway for this ride led by our club member Dean Auchenbach. Dean also serves as the President of Lebanon Valley Bicycle Coalition. Dean is an experienced battlefield guide, historian and reenactor. This guided tour will be a slow-paced historical tour to allow you to get a perspective of the terrain and see the monuments.

Hotel: Inn at Cemetery Hill, 613 Baltimore Street Gettysburg

Reservations: 717-334-9281

People should call the hotel and make their own reservations. They require a deposit of one night's stay when making your reservation. Reference the block of rooms or the "Lebanon Ski and Sport Club". Rooms will be held until August 12, 2024. We put a hold on 15 rooms.

Rate: \$160 per night plus 11% tax. About \$178 total. Per night.

You can reserve for two nights -- Friday September 27 to Sunday September 29. They do allow a one-night stay so you can reserve for just Saturday night. A free breakfast is provided at the hotel from 6:30 am to 10 am. If you make a reservation and later need to cancel, their policy is cancellations done seven days prior to check-in will be refunded. People staying overnight may store bicycles in their hotel room. The hotel is within walking distance of restaurants, shopping, and pubs.

The bicycle tour on Saturday will leave from the Hotel parking lot, time to be determined (probably around 10 am or so).

If people are just coming in for Saturday night at the hotel, or just coming in for the ride and not staying overnight, they should meet the group at the hotel parking lot.

The tour will be about 15 miles total with a slow pace and several stops at areas to highlight monuments, battlefield events and stories of what happened.

Length of tour will be what the group wants but figure 4 hours plus.
